

Active Transportation Plan

Upper Uwchlan Township completed an Active Transportation Plan in January 2024 with grant funding from Chester County's Vision Partnership Program.

The plan identifies ways to expand connections for walking and biking in and around the township. The plan was developed over a 12-month planning process that included steering committee meetings, an online community survey, and two public workshops. The plan presents proposed connections to help close key gaps in the existing network and connect residential areas, schools, and other key destinations, such as the Village of Eagle and Marsh Creek State Park. The plan highlights 13 catalyst capital improvement projects that can kick-start implementation of the plan. The catalyst projects range from near-term and low-cost projects to longer term projects that require additional coordination, evaluation, and resources. Based on the plan, the Township received \$1 million in federal transportation




funds for construction of a pedestrian path on the west side of Pottstown Pike between existing trails in Upland Farms Park and the intersection of Pottstown Pike and Fellowship Road/Reserve Drive. This was identified as a phase to better connect the Windsor Ridge community with the township's existing sidewalk and trail network.

The township will be using the Active Transportation Plan to guide improvements and policies that support safe walking and biking in Upper Uwchlan.

From the Township Manager:

Dear Upper Uwchlan Residents,

Snow is on the ground outside my office window but before you know it spring will be here. Our Public Works Department has done a great job keeping the roads safe but will soon be getting ready for road work and maintaining our parks and athletic fields.

The Township completed an Active Transportation Plan that was accepted by the Board of Supervisors at its February 20th meeting. The plan has outlined ways the Township can improve walking and biking within the Township. The updating of the Township's Comprehensive Plan will be completed by the end of 2024. There will be opportunities for public input on the comprehensive plan throughout the year. Keep an eye on the Township website and Facebook page for information on the Comp Plan update.

There are a few land development projects starting or are beginning the process within the Township. Celebree School (Preschool) located at the corner of Route 100 and Station Blvd. should break ground in late spring or early summer. PJ Reilly headquarters located on Park Road should be under construction before the end of 2024. Ducklings Preschool has filed a land development application for 241 Park Road and hopes to break ground before the end of 2024.

We have some exciting events planned in 2024 highlighted by the always improving Block Party scheduled for June 15th from 6 to 9 PM.

Recycle Right!

Curbside Single Stream Recycling

Toss these items directly into your Recycling Toter. DO NOT use plastic bags.

PAPER Newspapers, cardboard, paper bags, magazines and junk mail, phone books, home/office paper, paper egg cartons, rinsed milk and juice cartons, clean pizza boxes, and boxboard food packaging. Break down and flatten.



PLASTIC Containers marked #1—#5 and #7. Throw away caps and lids. Rinse thoroughly.



METAL Food and drink cans, pie plates, clean aluminum foil. Rinse thoroughly. Empty aerosol cans.



GLASS Clean food and drink bottles and jars. Throw away lids. Rinse thoroughly.



For the Garbage Toter



TRASH Food waste; light bulbs; mirrors, plate glass, window glass, drinkware and crystal; ceramic cups and plates, flower pots, ovenware; caps/lids from recyclable containers; empty paint cans, empty oil cans and bottles; plastic food wrappers, plastic bags; wax or plastic coated boxes/paper, plastic and Tyvek envelopes; straws, tissues, towels, napkins, plasticware; Styrofoam/polystyrene; shoes and clothing; metallic wrapping paper.

NOTE: ALL BOX SPRINGS and MATTRESSES MUST be placed in plastic bags (separately) and put out at curbside the night before a Bulk collection day. If they are not in plastic bags, they WILL NOT be taken. Mattress Bags are sold at hardware stores and online.

RULES on Extra Recycling:

EXCESS MATERIALS MUST BE BAGGED OR BOUND: Any recyclables that do not fit in your Toter must be placed in paper bags. Cardboard boxes must be broken down and bound with twine.

CARPETS MUST BE CUT UP AND BOUND INTO 3' SECTIONS and no more than one room at a time collected on **bulk day**.

All recyclables are to be placed directly into the recycling toter.



Recyclable materials include: aluminum products, glass, plastic, cardboard, newspaper, magazines, periodicals, bulk mail, phone books.

Reminder: The Township is no longer legally allowed to collect e-waste such as televisions, computers, etc.

Please note: Yard waste is not considered trash and should NOT be put in with your trash. Use open containers (NO Attached lids) or brown compost bags. If yard waste is put in trash toter, it will not be taken.

The burning of recyclable materials, to include yard waste, trees, shrubs, leaves, garbage, etc. is strictly prohibited. Burning permits are no longer issued.

Trash & Recycling

UUT Toters are your **PRIMARY** containers for trash and recycling collection.

Place Toters at the curb the night before your collection day, and at least 3 feet apart and away from mailboxes, cars and other obstacles.

Bulk pick-up is the 3rd pick-up of the month.

DO NOT PUT CLEAN RECYCLING INTO PLASTIC BAGS – THEY ARE NOT RECYCLABLE!

Recycling is to be put directly into the recycling toter, UNBAGGED. If you put in plastic bags, it does not go into the single stream recycling, it's contaminated and goes to TRASH, DEFEATING the purpose of recycling and not helping the environment. Styrofoam is not recyclable.

SEE Chart for proper handling of recycling!

Bulk trash reminder: No construction material will be collected at any time. Do not put out for trash or bulk.

Box Springs and Mattresses must be placed in plastic bags (separately) for bulk collection, they will not be collected if they are not in bags.

Compost Leaves and Yard Waste: 36 Collections Annually - Wednesdays

Place leaves, grass clippings and yard waste in biodegradable paper bags or open containers. DO NOT use UUT Toters. DO NOT use plastic bags; these collections are composted. DO NOT overload bags. Tree limbs (no larger than 3" diameter and 3' long) must be bundled with string/twine. Place yard waste at the curb the night before collection to ensure it will be picked up.



PIPELINE SAFETY

Did you know that more than a dozen pipelines traverse Upper Uwchlan?

They must be marked along their entire length and you must be able to see from one marker to the next.



In the car or walking, it's fun to see who can find the most pipeline markers. You'll be amazed how many there are from the Lexus dealership to the Marshalls (Rt. 100 to Rt. 113 to N. Whitford Rd. to Rt. 30 Business) to Campbell Blvd to Marshalls Parking lot.

Distracted Driving



Distracted driving is dangerous, claiming approximately 3,477 lives and injuring 391,000 people per year. It is illegal in Pennsylvania to use a mobile device when operating a motor vehicle. The use is not limited to just texting. It is also illegal to operate a motor vehicle when utilizing earphones in both ears.

The Upper Uwchlan Township Police strictly enforce the rules of the road regarding distracted drivers.

Understanding Illicit Stormwater Discharge

Imagine looking at a house to buy and seeing soapy water flowing from a pipe into a ditch. Would that make you reconsider buying the house, not knowing what this discharge was? Or noticing a murky colored stream that smelled musty, like sewage, even though it hadn't rained for days. These are both signs of illicit stormwater discharge. Illicit discharges happen when things other than rainwater go into the stormwater system.

Stormwater systems utilize stormwater grates, underground pipes, and open swales to convey untreated surface storm run-off to water bodies, including streams and lakes. When any of these illicit discharges enter the stormwater system, these pollutants can cause public health concerns, including harmful bacteria counts, fish kills, and excess nutrients that harm aquatic wildlife.

Examples of Illicit Discharge

- Soapy water, like from car washing or laundry, going into waterways.
- Waste from septic tanks or industries entering stormwater systems.
- Dumping waste oil, chemicals, or pesticides into storm drains.



Recognizing Illicit Discharge

- Strange colors, smells, or scum in water could mean illicit discharge.
- Dead fish and other wildlife can also indicate a problem.
- Makeshift pipes or hoses leading to waterways might be illicit discharge, especially if you see something draining from them on dry days.



What You Can Do

- Dispose of chemicals properly at special collection events. Visit <https://www.chestercountyswa.org/117/Household-Hazardous-Waste> for a list of dates for household waste collection events.
- Handle pet waste correctly to prevent harmful bacteria and excess nutrients from entering our waterways.
- Wash your car on your lawn so that excess water, soap, and dirt are filtered through grass and vegetation.

Together We Can Help

Report illicit discharges to local authorities or environmental agencies. Remember, what you put on land ends up in the water. Let's work together to keep streams and lakes clean! Safe Digging is a Shared Responsibility



Traditionally outdoor projects start in the spring. Pennsylvania 811 Safe Digging Month serves as a reminder to all excavators and homeowners to **call 811 at least 3 business days before you dig**, so the approximate location of the underground utility lines can be identified and marked by facility owners. The call before you dig process helps to prevent injuries, property damages, inconvenient utility outages, and fines. Safe Digging is a shared responsibility among excavators, homeowners, facility owners, municipalities, cities and county level management and planners.

Keep Grass Clippings Out of Storm Drains

Residents and landscapers are reminded to keep grass clippings off of the streets.



The grass ends up in the storm drains and causes them to backup or drain improperly. It can also lead to contamination in the waterways.

Report a Pothole



Everyone hates potholes.

Unfortunately, they are a fact of life in Pennsylvania, thanks to our severe freeze/thaw cycle.

Keystone Collections is the New Township Tax Collector



Effective January 1, 2024, Keystone Collections Group was appointed as the tax collector for Upper Uwchlan Township

Township tax bills were mailed by Keystone at the beginning of February, so all residents should have received their township tax bill – separate from the Chester County tax bill this year. The change was made to reduce the cost of mailing and processing the township's tax bills.

Please note that the township's tax rate is a low 1.034 mills and there has not been an increase in the township's tax rate since 2006.

The due dates for the township tax bills are as follows:
