Important Changes in Utility Billing

The Township is pleased to announce that we have successfully transitioned the billing for solid waste (trash and recycling) and sewer services from Berkheimer to the Township effective January 1, 2013. We felt it was necessary to bring all the billing activities in-house in order to better serve our residents.

These are a few of the services that are offered:

- Online accessibility to your account history so that you can check your balance or status of payments at any time. Your account can only be accessed with your private PIN number. The PIN number is located on your bill or you may call the Township office and we will give it to you.
- Ability to pay online with a credit card or via ACH (there are nominal fees charged by the service provider - the Township is not charging a fee for these services)
- You may pre-schedule payments through ACH
- Electronic payment through your own bank - please realize that those payments are received by us as **checks**, so it is important to allow for processing and mailing to insure our timely receipt.

Sewer services are billed on a quarterly basis. The billing periods and payment due dates are as follows:

Solid waste services are billed once annually. Bills were mailed at the end of January. The discount of two percent (2%) applied to the bills paid on or before March 15, 2013. After that date, the full \$315.00 is due. You may pay in installments of \$157.50, as long as the total amount of \$315.00 is paid by September 9, 2013. After that date, the account is considered delinquent and interest and penalties will be applied. Any amounts that remain unpaid at the end of the year may cause your property to be lien.

Please remember to make your checks payable to Upper Uwchlan Township (trash and recycling) or Upper Uwchlan Township Municipal Authority or UUTMA (sewer). Any checks received that are payable to Berkheimer will be returned to you because we cannot deposit them if they are not payable to the Township or the Authority. **If you pay electronically through your bank, please change the payee and mailing address with your financial institution to reflect the change.**

If you are paying sewer and trash at the same time, we would appreciate separate checks. Also, please make sure to use the account number from your current invoice and not your old Berkheimer account number.

Boards, Authorities, Commissions & Officials

Pennsylvania counties are divided into four principal types of municipalities — cities, boroughs and townships of the first and second class — with each kind operating under a different code of State Laws. Chester County has one city (Coatesville), 15 boroughs, one township of the first class (Caln) and 56 townships of the second class.

In 1858, when the original Uwchlan Township was divided into Uwchlan and Upper Uwchlan, the present Upper Uwchlan Township was incorporated as a township of the second class. As such, it is permitted to elect and appoint certain officials. Elected officials are Supervisors, Auditors and Tax Collector. Each group is independent of the others.

Additionally, elected officials who represent Upper Uwchlan, as well as other Municipalities, are: School Director, District Justice, Constable and your Federal, State and County Representatives.

Upper Uwchlan Township Police Tips - Solicitors

The Township of Upper Uwchlan wishes to protect residents from fraud and crime while promoting the safety and privacy of residents by reasonably limiting hours of

solicitation and requiring permits to conduct this type of activity within the Township. As a result, those who wish to solicit within the Township of Upper Uwchlan are required to obtain a permit prior to conducting any solicitation activity. After examination of the applicant and his/her application and, where necessary, after verification of the references or other means deemed, the Upper Uwchlan Township Police Department may issue to the applicant the required certification. Approved

solicitors must carry the approved permit with them at all times. The employees of the company must display a card that is attached to the outermost garment. Residents can ask to see the permit. If solicitors appear in your neighborhood and they are not displaying the proper credentials, immediately call 911. There have been cases where people posing as solicitors are actually probing the community for potential victims of future crimes. Keep your community safe and make the call to the police.

Upper Uwchlan Township Municipal Authority (WWTP)

The Upper Uwchlan Township Municipal Authority (Authority) wastewater treatment plants (WWTP) are limited by the amount of organic material they can treat. Aside from the normal residential bathroom and kitchen wastes, these facilities are not designed to handle large amounts of food waste, oils and grease. Recently, some of the Authority WWTPs have experienced an increase in organic "loading" that has a negative impact on the wastewater treatment process.

In order to reduce the organic material at a WWTP facility, the Authority requests that residents with homes connected to a sanitary sewer system discontinue the practice of disposing of food waste and cooking grease in the sink drain. The Authority asks that you dispose of all food waste and cooking grease with your solid waste/garbage collection. To dispose of cooking grease with your solid waste/garbage, pour the cooking grease in a container and let it cool before disposing of it into the garbage can.

As a more eco-friendly alternative to disposing of food waste into the garbage can, consider composting it in your backyard. MS4 - Keep our Waterways Clean

Did you know that failing septic systems have been linked to water quality problems in streams, lakes, shellfish beds and coastal areas? You can take a number of steps that are easy and painless to ensure that your septic system does not contribute to water quality problems. Another benefit of properly managing your septic system is the long term health and operation of your system which translates to cost savings \$\$.

Steps That Can Reduce Pollutant Loadings from Septic Systems


1. Do not wait until septic system shows sign of failure. Inspect the system annually and have it pumped-out at least once every three years.
2. Keep records of pumping and maintenance and a map of the location of your system and drain field.
3. Practice water conservation indoors and divert roof drains and surface water away from the system.
4. Use caution in disposing materials down the drain. Household chemicals can kill the bacteria that make the system work and non-degradable materials (cigarette butts, etc.) can clog the system.
5. Keep heavy equipment and vehicles off your system and drain field.
6. Don't cover your drain field with

impermeable surfaces that can block evaporation and the air needed for effluent treatment.

7. Do not use organic solvents or phosphorous detergents (cleaners) in your system.
8. Limit the use of garbage disposals.

Garbage disposals can double the amount of solids added to a septic tank, creating the need for more frequent pump-outs.

The Township provides one (1) 96-gallon wheeled container for trash and one (1) 64-gallon wheeled container for recycling. These are to be used as the PRIMARY container for trash/recycling collection.

The carts are easy to maneuver and have hinged lids to prevent blowing litter, reduce odors and keep pests out. The carts are township property and should be left at properties should you move.

The goal is to increase recycling participation and reduce solid waste costs.

Compost Lawn and Leaf Collection: (17 collections annually - Wednesdays)

Seventeen (17) yard waste (including grass clippings) and leaf collections will occur throughout the year. Use your open containers (no lids) or Biodegradable Bags for leaf and yard waste disposal. Biodegradable bags are available at the Township Office for \$2.50/5-bag bundle. Leaf and yard waste debris placed in plastic bags will NOT be collected; this material is destined for the composting process.

New Electronics Recycling Law!

Televisions, computers, monitors, laptops, etc. are no longer permitted to be disposed of with your household trash. A new State law, effective January 24, 2013, requires these items to be recycled. One recycling option is to contact the Stores where these electronics are typically purchased. Another disposal option is Chester County's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Events, which will now include electronics waste (E-Waste). The 2013 HHW event dates are posted on our website – the next event is Saturday, May 18, 2013 at the Owen J. Roberts Middle School, 981 Ridge Road (Route 23), Pottstown PA 19465. 

Township Hosts Community Emergency Response Team Volunteer Appreciation Night

On January 24, 2013, the Upper Uwchlan Township Emergency Management Planning Commission (EMPC) sponsored a Community Emergency Response Team Volunteer Appreciation Night. The event was an opportunity for the Township to show its appreciation for the Township residents who volunteer their time to help our community be prepared in the event of an emergency.

Approximately 45 people were in attendance including all Township Supervisors, the Township Manager and Police Chief, community volunteers and various program presenters. Informative presentations were given by the Chester County Department of Emergency Services, American Red Cross, Exelon Nuclear Generating Station, Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services, Uwchlan Ambulance, Lionville Fire Company, and our Upper Uwchlan Township Police Department. A Homeland Security presentation was given by EMPC member, professor and author, Keith Logan.

The EMPC is a nine person commission whose purpose is to assist the Township in emergency preparedness on an individual and community basis. Meetings are held eight times per year. Township residents who would like to help the community with emergency preparedness are encouraged to become involved.

We are fortunate to have approximately 40 Township residents who have been trained as volunteers in the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program. This

free program trains our residents in first aid, CPR and other emergency preparedness activities. Free backpacks containing first aid kits and other emergency preparedness items are distributed to the CERT volunteers.



The more CERT volunteers we have throughout our Township, the better prepared our community will be in the event of an emergency. In addition to typical emergency situations, Upper Uwchlan Township has unique natural and man-made facilities that present special emergency preparedness needs such as the Limerick Nuclear Generating Station, many underground gas pipelines and the dam at Marsh Creek State Park.

Many Americans take for granted the availability of fire, ambulance and other emergency preparedness and response services. An overwhelming majority of these providers are volunteers who serve as part of their civic duty. We welcome you to join us as citizens helping citizens.



THE FINAL UPGRADE: PAY FROM YOUR SMARTPHONE

When I started as your elected Tax Collector in 2010, there was only one method of payment: by paper check to Upper Uwchlan Township by mail or in person. Soon after that, I was able to provide residents with “upgrades” in the way they pay:

- Kept the personal touch by retaining payment by check at the Township building or by mail.
- I partnered with a Chester County native, DNB First Bank, to allow residents to pay at any DNB First Bank branch in addition to paying at the Township.
- Set up the ability for residents to pay online from their computers, thus doing away with the paper check process.

By now all the 2013 bills have been mailed to Upper Uwchlan Township residents, so my final “upgrade” to the pay process is no surprise: the ability to pay from a smartphone by simply scanning a “QR” code which will take the resident directly to the online website for payment. QR codes have been around for awhile, but as far as I can determine Upper Uwchlan Township is the only township (indeed the only municipality: township, school district or even the County) that provides QR codes on its bills for ease of payment (it’s OK to brag to non-residents).

TAX TIME: NEED A RECEIPT?

Residents who may need receipts for payment of prior year’s taxes should do the following: send an email (blagarde2@gmail.com) requesting a receipt, along with the address of the property for which you need it, and I will email you the receipt right away.

I THINK MY TAXES ARE ESCROWED; WILL MY ESCROW AGENT PAY MY ORIGINAL BILL?

Boy, I wish I had a nickel for every time I’ve heard THAT over the last three years! Whatever arrangement you have with your bank/mortgage company/escrow agent is between you and them; I have no knowledge of it. That is why I suggest on the bill that residents forward my bills to the escrow company, or at least contact them about the bill.

HOW ABOUT INTERIM BILLS?

Interim bills are bills sent out after the “original” bill you just received is sent out. Typically these are to cover some sort of change (up or down) in your property’s assessed value. Your escrow agent will NOT know about these interim bills, so definitely discuss interim bills with them. Park Road Trail Phase IV DVRPC Awards Township CMAQ Grant

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) recently awarded Upper Uwchlan Township a Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) grant in the amount of **\$764,726** for the construction of Phase IV of the Park Road Trail. This final phase of the Park Road Trail will connect the Township’s existing trail network to the Marsh Creek State Park. The trail extension will also connect Township residents with the Villages of Eagle and Byers and Hankin’s Eagleview development, all regionally important economic centers.

The project is currently in the final design, engineering and permitting phase. In the near future, the Township will be contacting residents who live on or around Park Road in order to provide an update on the scope of the project and answer any questions about the project. Updates will be posted to the Township’s website as the project moves through final design and into the construction phase.
