



ADOPT-A-ROADWAY PROGRAM FACT SHEET

The Adopt-A-Township Roadway Program reinforces the Township's litter pick-up efforts by involving citizens across the Commonwealth in the anti-litter efforts in Pennsylvania's collective "front yard" - its 150,000 acres of roadside.

- ◆ Adopting groups must sign an agreement with Upper Uwchlan Township.
- ◆ Groups must agree to adopt at least one-mile portions of Township Roadways. Upper Uwchlan must agree the roadway is suitable for adoption.
- ◆ Groups must agree to pick-up litter at least two times a year. The agreement runs for two years. It will renew automatically unless either party chooses to terminate it.
- ◆ Safety is top priority. Group leaders must use safety materials provided by Upper Uwchlan Township and must conduct safety meetings with group members before each pick-up.
- ◆ All participants must wear orange safety vests and must post "Litter Crew Ahead" signs during scheduled pick-up periods. Vests and signs are provided by Upper Uwchlan Township.
- ◆ Upper Uwchlan Township will post two signs (one in each direction) naming the adopting group or individual on the adopted portion of said Township Roadway.
- ◆ Participant must be at least ten years old with all participants under 18 years of age accompanied by adults.
- ◆ Any civic-minded group or individual may participate, with the exception of those representing elected officials or candidates for public office.
